I will now highlight some of the projects that the executive committee plans to embark on this year.

- **a**. I will appoint some of our members to act as Zonal Coordinators, to serve as points of contact between members of their respective zones and our community leadership. They will also help to facilitate the reception and settlement of new arrivals in their zones, coordinate zonal Easter and Christmas parties, and encourage regular visitation of members to one another.
 - i. I am glad to appoint Dr Ali Kidmas as Coordinator for the North and East zone, comprising Launceston, Smithton, Georgetown and St. Helens. He will be assisted in this role by Mr Tosin Omilani.
 - ii. Dr Chidimma Esomeju will be assisted by Dr Olowole Olomola as Coordinator for the West Coast comprising Burnie, Latrobe and Devonport.
 - iii. Our Secretary, Mr Babajide Omojola will serve as Coordinator for the South including Hobart and environs. Please join me in congratulating all our Zonal Coordinators. They deserve our full support and cooperation.
- **b.** We will work closely with the Community Languages Tasmania to see the feasibility of setting up Nigerian Language Schools for our children. We will focus on the primary languages of Yoruba, Igbo and Hausa with schools based in Hobart and Launceston, depending on the numbers of children, volunteer teachers, availability of grants and other logistics.
- **c.** We will expand our social media handles to better interface with Tasmanian government programs and businesses. This includes the creation of new community accounts on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and YouTube.


- **d.** Some members of our executive committee led by the Secretary shall embark on an outreach visit to Launceston to canvass for better participation and membership.

- **a.** CONAPA has secured an official letter from the Comptroller General of Immigration to revalidate all unused passport payments to Innovate 1 owing to COVID travel restrictions.
- **b.** The incoming Nigerian Ambassador Designate Ndubuisi Madueke is expected to arrive Australia in the coming months.
- c. A Nigerian company has now been assigned to conduct the data capturing for National Identity Number (NIN) and BVN for all Nigerians in Australia. CONAPA is actively involved in the planning and it is envisaged that these exercises shall be conducted in each State and Territory to minimise stress for all Nigerians.
